Baptist Hill Cemetery [AA]

The Baptist Hill Cemetery has been identified by the Texas Historical Commission by the GPS coordinates given above. Baptist Hill Cemetery is described as being located adjacent to the Chappell Hill Community Cemetery and the Sample Cemetery. Baptist Hill has no visible indications of existence. A local resident came forth during the search for this historical Cemetery

Site and gave information about her grandmother. The Baptist Hill Cemetery is the eternal resting place for Mrs. Rebecca Newsome circa 1883-1923, grandmother of a loving person that remembers and passes by frequently in memory of her departed loved one. Because there are only memories of the space in an open cow pasture, many ancestors have been forgotten. It is noted that this abandonment is a result of past litigation about the continued use of this sacred place for burial purposes. The courts ruled in favor of the property owner of the time. The many names of departed souls previously interred in this place have been lost in history and are no longer remembered. Originally, this Cemetery Site was dedicated for use by the members of Ebenezer Missionary Baptist Church on Nicholson Lake Rd. This Church was organized in 1866, and continues serving the community to this day. The Baptist Hill Cemetery site was never affiliated with the adjacent larger Chappell Hill Community Cemetery.
