Gates Cemetery

One of the oldest cemeteries in Washington County is situated on a hill on the west bank of the Brazos River near Graball. On Browns College Rd off FM 2726 for 0.1 mile past intersection, into pasture road from gate, approximately 3,300 ft. Ranch owned by Mr Alattar, and is currently scheduled for subdivision. Reportedly developers mapping all cultural resources prior to division. High rock wall remains on E side of cemetery, piles of rock and remnants of wall on other three sides, also large Cedar stumps. 1936 State of Texas marker, CSA, Rep of Tx, early Austin Colony settlement. approximately 0.06 acre.
