Jackson Family Cemetery

30° 19' 41.64" N – 96° 14' 46.04" W Approximate
N of FM 105

In a thicket on top of a hill some distance north of the old LaBahia Road and about 3 miles northwest of the intersection of State Highway 105 and Farm Road 912. Only those stones within an iron fence remain. Within the living memory of the inhabitants of the area, there were at least two dozen more graves on this site.
