## Sommer Family Cemetery

FM 1935

A small family cemetery located at 12209 Farm Road 1935 on Hidalgo Bluff, enclosed by a chain link fence and meticulously kept by the Sommer family.

ALBONO, John, b. July 10 1913, d. January 22 2004 - Husband of Charlotte Sommers Albano. Charlotte is the eldest daughter of John F. and Esther Sommers.

BAILEY, Conrad John, b. 1894, d. 1895 - Son of Emma Sommer Bailey and John Bailey. Emma was the fourth child and daughter of Marie and Fritz J. Sommer

BAILEY, Willie May, b. 1895, d. 1900 - Daughter of Emma Sommer Bailey and John Bailey. Emma was the fourth child and daughter of Marie and Fritz J. Sommer.

BOLLMANN, Gladys Evelyn Kramer - 1922 - 1966, - Third child and daughter of Rachel Sommer Kramer and Arnold T. Kramer.

EGGERS, Francis May Kramer b, May 10 1921, d. August 3 1953 - Fourth child and daughter of Rachel Sommer Kramer and Arnold T. Kramer.

FEHLER, Esther, b. 1891, d. 1898 - Young daughter of Ida Sommer Schwarze Fehler.

FEHLER, Ida, Sommer Schwartz b. June 21, 1865, d. June 5, 1927, Third generation, oldest daughter and first born on Fritz J. and Marie Sommer. Her first husband was Heinrich F.W. Schwarze. She later married F. Fehler. She was a special nurse who sat with people in their homes. On stone - FOR ME TO LIVE IS CHRIST AND TO DIE IS GAIN. PHIL. 1:21

KRAMER, Arnold T., (1897 - 1986) - Husband of Rachel Sommer. He and Rachel lived in Wichita Falls, Texas. They were blessed with 6 girls and 4 boys

KRAMER, Kenneth Bryant, b. January 13 1928, d. September 5 2001 - Seventh child and son of Rachel Sommer Kramer and Arnold T. Kramer.

KRAMER, Rachel, b. November 30, 1917, d. May 22, 1919 - First child and daughter of Rachel Sommer Kramer and Arnold T. Kramer.

KRAMER, Rachel S., b. 1898, d. 1956 - Fourth generation, third child and oldest daughter of Conrad and Lottie Sommer.

SCHWARZE, Heinrich F. W., b. October 5, 1861, d. August 27, 1885, First husband of Ida Sommer. He died when a mule team bolted and he was caught in the reins, dragging him to his death. On the back of Heinrich Schwarzes tombstone - In German: If we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord. For

this very reason, Christ died and returned to life so that he might be the Lord of both the dead and the living. Romer (Romans) 14:8-9

SOMMER, C. F., b. November 11, 1866, d. August 25, 1920 - Third generation and oldest son of Marie and Fritz J. Sommer. He died from typhoid fever, contracted in Grimes County from creek water he drank while hauling cord wood for the Sommer gin.

SOMMER, Dorothy L., b. April 12, 1926, d. March 30, 1948 - Second child, daughter of Fred C. and Hattie Sommer. She died of a brain tumor.

SOMMERS, Esther Nelson, b. October 26 1893 d. July 14 1989 - Wife of John Frederick Sommers

SOMMER, Fred C., Jr., b. March 15, 1936, d. July 8, 1936 - Fourth and infant son of Fred C. and Hattie Sommer. He died from the German measles after being misdiagnosed as having diphtheria.

SOMMER, Fritz C. W., b. January 24, 1875, d. August 23, 1882 - Third generation, sixth child and son of Marie and Fritz Sommer. IN GERMAN - LUCUS (LUKE) 18:16 - But Jesus called the children to him and said, Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belong to such as these.

SOMMER, Fred Conrad, b. May 4, 1902, d. March 16, 1975 - Fourth generation, third child of Conrad and Lottie Sommer. He and his wife Hattie were blessed with four children

SOMMER, Hattie Pohlmeier, b. December 7 1902, d. February 20, 1982 - Wife of Fred Conrad Sommer.

SOMMER, Joachim Johann Wilhelm Friedrich Sommer (Fritz J.), b. July 19, 1831, d. September 25, 1892 - oldest son of Johann and Maria Sommer to immigrate to America. Two younger sisters also immigrated with the family. The three oldest children of the family remained in Germany. At one time, he owned 3 cotton gins in Washington County. In German on front - I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God. Hiob (Job) 19:25-26

SOMMER, Henriette Anna Louise, b. October 8, 1886, d. November 15, 1900 - Third generation, tenth child and daughter of Marie and Fritz Sommer. In German on Front - I tell you the truth, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be condemned; he has crossed over from death to life. Joh. (John) 5:24

SOMMERS, John Frederich, b. July 27 1896, d. April 28, 1988 - Fourth generation, first and eldest son of Conrad and Lottie Sommer. He resided in Dallas, Texas.

SOMMER, Johann G. J., b. June 14, 1798, d. August 16, 1885 - First generation to immigrate from Germany in 1845 and settle on the Hidalgo Bluff. On stone in German - LUCUS (Luke) 2:29-30 Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you now dismiss your servant in peace. For my eyes have seen your salvation.

SOMMER, Joseph F., b. May 28, 1882, d. July 13, 1954 - Third generation, ninth child and son of Marie and Fritz J. Sommer.

SOMMER, Lottie, b. October 27, 1875, d. June 21, 1933 - Wife of Conrad F. Sommer, and mother of five fourth generation children, three boys and 2 girls. - On stone - HERE RESTS IN PEACE

SOMMER, Maria D. F., b. July 19, 1797, d. August 5, 1885, wife of Johann G. J. Sommer -First generation to immigrate from Germany in 1845 and settle on the Hidalgo Bluff. On the back of Maria D.F. Sommers tombstone - The length of our days is seventy years--- or eighty, if we have the strength; yet their span is but trouble and sorrow, for they quickly pass, and we fly away. Psalm 90:10

SOMMER, Marie Justine Georgine Bewie, b. April 11, 1845, d. September 3, 1921 Second generation and wife of Fritz J. Sommer. She was born in Haber, Province of Hanover, Germany and was 2 years old when her parents arrived in America. She married Fritz J. Sommer on August 9th, 1864 in St. Louis, Missouri. Marie and Fritz were blessed with 11 children, 6 girls and 5 boys. In German on Front - Father, I want those you have given me to be with me where I am, and to see my glory, the glory you have given me because you loved me before the creation of the world. Joh. (John) 17:24
