Washington State Park Cemetery

30° 19' 35.53" N – 96° 10' 07.30" W

The graves of two Texas patriots moved from the old public cemetery at Washington to the grounds of the Washington State Park. Asa Brigham, Alcalde of Brazoria Municipality, 1835, signer of the Declaration of Independence and John William Smith, soldier in the Army of the Republic.
