Harmel Grave [2005]

Latitude 30° 12' 22" - Longitude 96° 34' 09"

Located on private property 1.5 miles NW of US Hwy 290 along 1700 FM 1948 Rd.

An unmarked single grave was discovered circa 1958 beneath a grove of large oak trees on private property once belonging to the Harmel Family. During widening and reconstruction of a new roadway currently designated FM 1948, this gravesite was in the path of the new roadway. Permission was granted to move the grave. A former TxDOT employee and other eye witness accounts of the careful exhumation indicated that the remains were that of an adult female. The remains were reinterred in an open meadow at a higher location approximately 300yds. west and 100yds. north of the original site away from the roadway. A wooden construction post marks the location. Neither research nor current Harmel Family descendants are able to identify the unnamed person buried at this site.
